

# ARTISTIC DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE



T:>Works Artistic Atelier supports a mid-career artist or creative who is looking for new challenges to their work. As part of our vision of thought leadership amongst artists, it is pertinent not to limit this capacity development. In a country where artists are seen as vendor suppliers by government funding agencies, it is important to insist that artists are primary to generating public discourse, debate, and enriching the public life of our citizenry. Without engaged artists in the

public sphere, we are all the poorer as a nation, destined to lag behind in a governance style dominated by control at all costs, fear of innovation and difference.

I was convinced after our work in the international alternative universities/artist residencies programme, The Flying Circus Project, and rebooting the Singapore Arts Festival as Singapore International Festival of Arts (SIFA), there was an urgent need to reduce the infantilization prevalent in Singapore. The trend to simply concentrate on emerging artists and not planning the career paths of mid-career artists may result in a lack of sustainability in the ecosystem of the arts. Further the absolute dearth of care for mature artists, who have pioneered the contemporary arts in Singapore (circa mid 1980s), may lead to a brain drain and the collapse of collaboration between citizen and government in the future potentialities of Singapore.

The hallmark of the Artistic Atelier is that the mid-career artist or creative is encouraged to develop carte blanche their trajectory for three years. T:>Works commits our artistry, our engagement resources, our intellectual care to the Artistic Atelier. Instead of demanding the mid-career artist or creative to become part of the company infrastructure, we value their independence outside of our structure, to lead their own creative team to fruition. T:>Works collaborates rather than controls the narrative.

T:>Works began this new direction in 2019 with the invitation to Noorlinah Mohamed to begin a festival platform, focused on engagement and listening specifically to communities. Noorlinah continued the trajectory of the O.P.E.N. pre-festival of engagement from SIFA into T:>Works Festival of Women or Not Ordinary Work, N.O.W. We were honoured to support her journey and hope this will continue into our collaborative Artistic Atelier with Brian Gothong Tan.

I have known Brian since inviting him to Ho Chi Minh City to participate in The Flying Circus Project in 2007. In 2008, we collaborated deeply and joyfully in the creating Vivien and The Shadows in Carolina Performing Arts, Chapel Hill, North Carolina, USA. These TheatreWorks (the former name of T:>Works) projects built up our trust and we continued working together in different formats: Bertolt Brecht's Good Person of Szechwan for Landestheater Linz, European Cultural Capital 2009, the 2015 SIFA commission of The Incredible Border Crossers in Palais de Tokyo in Paris, and in 2016, his own SIFA commission sited within Ron Arad's installation at Gardens by the Bay. So we are no strangers in collaboration and I am very happy to welcome him to this parallel artistic utopia, the paratopia of T:>Works Artistic Atelier.

## **DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE**



When Keng Sen approached me sometime in 2020 during the first lockdown about the idea of creating an artistic atelier, I was intrigued. My journey with T:>Works really started with the 2007 edition of the Flying Circus, in which Keng Sen assembled an international group of artistic nomads and took us to places like Pulau Ubin, a cruise to nowhere and Ho Chi Minh City.

That experience had a profound impact on the way I view art and my own artistic process; that being an artist in this day and age meant something more than creating a product that could be consumed by the public. Living on a tiny island like Singapore that is highly controlled, it is very easy to lose sight of what is at stake, when economics rule, and concepts like spirit and soul hardly mean anything. But for the next few years since that Flying Circus, I was caught up in the machinery. The truth is it is very difficult, or near impossible to be an artist in Singapore. There is just no space, and time, here to be radically creative and experimental, and to truly dream of something that is profound and meaningful to the world.

The Swimming Pool Library is my first tentative step into this atelier, where I go back to my artistic roots of my visual arts training. I explore issues that are close to my heart that I have never really articulated throughout my life, and created nine chapters of various art forms in an immersive installation, with the 10th chapter as a performance that audiences will experience in the space. Due to the ever-changing health regulations, we had to scramble and re-structure The Swimming Pool Library, so now the 10th chapter will be released first, and the exhibition in January 2022, with various satellite talks and engagements with other artists, writers and thinkers in between. This re-think has produced a possible way to create art in this age of pandemic, that a work could exist for various months instead of a weekend or two. This will be the direction that the atelier will take on for the next three projects.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank my various collaborators who have contributed greatly to this project: Ronald, Lian, Umi, Izzy, Irfan and Karen, who have given life to the performance, and made real what was just abstract musings in my head. To Kaylene Tan and spell#7 for Various Gangsters, a text that has inspired me endlessly all these years. To the poets: Andrew, Andy, Rodrigo, Nikhil, Stephanie, Irie, Paul, Irfan and Carissa, for your courageous voices and powerful words. To my designers and the production crew who are part of my artistic family: Andy, Boon, Theresa, Ashley, Bobbie, Justina and the crew. To my cinematic brothers: Eric, Yee Sheng and Fadhli, of which I would have given up film if not for their infectious passion and inspiration. My T:>Works family, Traslin, Soo Mei, Noorlinah and of course Keng Sen, my mentor and guardian angel, who is responsible for making everything happen. And finally to James, who I am nothing without... thank you for always being there, supporting and believing in the vision and sticking through all the ups and downs.

28 - 31 October: Live performance @ 72-13 + Live-cast Online Stream

The inimitable cast – Karen Tan, Irfan Kasban, Umi Kalthum Bte Ismail, Lian Sutton, Azizul 'Izzy' Mahthir (a.k.a. Vanda Miss Joaquim) and Ronald Goh – perform texts from performance company spell#7's "Various Gangsters" (2002) and writings from "EXHALE: An Anthology of Queer Singapore Voices" to present a layered portrait of the quest for love and belonging in the garden city.

#### 6 - 23 January 2022: Visual and Sensory Exhibition

The full exhibition will open in January 2022, coinciding with Singapore Art Week. The genesis of The Swimming Pool Library, this visual and sensory segment, invites audiences to journey with the artist. Works including paper sketches, 3D printed sculptures, 3D film photography and DIY books will jigsaw the pieces of Tan's creative imagery of a boy's rite of passage.



10 November and 8 December 2021, 5 January 2022: Talk series "Othering in Gender and Sexuality"

Speak openly in Othering in Gender and Sexuality; that's the aim. We gather over three in-conversations, beginning 10 November, to engage in intimate and open dialogue, and raise questions on expected ways of behaving, representing, as well as belonging to a community as well as society. Each conversation identifies a specific knotty issue on othering that heightens the complexities of identities where society's sexual and gender labels do not apply.
